HB 1687 by Judicial Oversight (SGC) and Crow (Similar S 1272)

Child Support/Health Care Coverage; revises procedures for enforcement of health care coverage requirements of child support orders; provides for use of national medical support notice; provides procedures for modification of child support orders after DOR review finds certain deviation from child support guidelines; provides for notice to obligor's employer to withhold

premiums for health care coverage pursuant to national medical support notice, etc. Amends Chs. 61, 409. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

HB 1689 by Judicial Oversight (SGC) and Crow (Similar S 2012)

Paternity/Child Support/Genetic Test; authorizes HSMV to suspend driver's licenses & motor vehicle registrations to enforce compliance with order to appear for genetic testing to establish paternity or paternity & child support; provides for birth certificate information when paternity of child is determined pursuant to administrative proceeding; provides for proposed

order of paternity; provides for admissibility of genetic testing as evidence, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 1693 by Health Regulation (HCC), Farkas, Alexander, Haridopolos and Maygarden

Certificates of Need; exempts health services, long-term care hospital services, new construction, or certain tertiary health services programs from certificate-of-need review requirements for existing health facilities, provided licensed bed capacity is not exceeded; requires exempt programs to meet specified requirements; requires AHCA to adopt rules & monitor programs for compliance; provides conditions for expiration of exemption, etc. Amends 408.036. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

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
