CS/HB 489 by Council for Smarter Government, Henriquez, Kottkamp, Greenstein, Allen and Cantens (Similar CS/CS/S 0526)

Land Surveying & Mapping; exempts certain subordinate employees from provisions re regulation of land surveying & mapping; provides rulemaking authority to Board of Professional Surveyors & Mappers re use of professional titles by retirees; deletes obsolete prerequisite to take licensure examination to practice as surveyor & mapper; provides for liability & duty of care on agricultural land; provides grounds for disciplinary action, etc. Amends Ch. 472. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended February 13

HB 497 by Needelman (Similar S 0266, Compare H 1213, CS/S 0478)

Solid Waste Collection; clarifies provisions re treatment of existing solid waste contracts in areas affected by merger or incorporation of municipalities; exempts solid-waste or recovered-materials collection vehicles from prohibition against leaving engine running when vehicle is unattended. Amends 165.061, 316.1975. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time February 13

CS/HB 499 by Council for Smarter Government, Mahon, Melvin and Cantens (Similar CS/S 0664)

Real Estate Professionals; requires educational courses that are prerequisites to licensure as broker, broker-salesperson, or salesperson or maintenance or renewal of such licensure to be made available by means of distance learning; amends provision re real estate appraisers to require distance learning to be made available for continuing education courses, etc. Amends 475.17, .182, .451, .618; reenacts 475.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time February 13

HB 439 by Stansel, Mahon, Kravitz, Gibson, Attkisson, Melvin, Baxley, Cusack, Baker, Kendrick, Spratt, Heyman, Harrington, Waters, Allen, Hogan, Dockery, Greenstein and Lynn (Similar S 0496)

Military/Dependent Education Benefit; provides educational opportunity at state expense for dependent children of military personnel who died or suffered service-connected 100-percent total & permanent disability in Operation Enduring Freedom; specifies documentation which constitutes proof of eligibility for such benefits; revises eligibility age for dependent children of certain military personnel to receive educational benefits. Creates 295.0185; amends 295.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended February 20

CS/HB 459 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Kilmer, Waters, Harrington and Mahon (Similar S 2470, Compare H 0923, S 1506, S 2052)

Bright Futures Scholarship Program; provides eligibility requirements for students who enter military service; provides for reinstatement of awards; provides for Florida Bright Futures Scholarship awards for students attending United States military service academies; provides for issuance of warrants. Amends 240.40201, .40202; creates 240.40215. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended February 20

CS/CS/HB 463 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Education Appropriations (FRC), Garcia, Arza, Harrington, Hogan, Mahon and Melvin (Similar S 1090)

Student Courses/Withdrawal/Military; requires rules & policies by district school boards, community college district boards of trustees, & university boards of trustees re student withdrawal from courses due to military service; provides that student shall not suffer academic or financial penalties; authorizes refund of fees. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time February 20

HB 465 by Baxley, Mahon, Harrington, Hogan, Waters and Greenstein (Identical S 0534)

Military Children/Residency/Tuition; provides for classification as residents of dependent children of certain active duty members of Armed Services for tuition purposes. Amends 240.1201. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time February 20

HB 481 by Argenziano, Harrington, Kottkamp and Waters (Similar S 0292)

HS Diploma/Korean War Veterans; provides for award of standard high school diploma to certain Korean War Veterans. Amends 232.246. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time February 20

HB 165 by Paul, Fasano, Davis, Hogan, Spratt, Bennett, Clarke, Mahon, Kottkamp and Bilirakis (Identical S 0136)

Ad Val Tax/Disabled Ex-service; increases amount of exemption provided under specified provision of State Constitution for certain disabled ex-service members. Amends 196.24. Effective Date: 01/01/2003.

Read second time February 20

HB 477 by Baker (Compare CS/S 1430)

McTureous Memorial Highway/Lake Co.; designates portion of State Road 19 in Lake Co. as "Private Robert M. McTureous, Jr., U.S.M.C., Medal of Honor Memorial Highway"; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 805 by Kallinger, Fasano, Brummer, Trovillion, Allen, Bense, Baxley, Attkisson, Bilirakis, Hogan, Harrington and Waters (Identical S 1164)

Human Cloning Prohibition; creates "Human Cloning Prohibition & Responsibility Act of 2002"; provides that it is unlawful to perform or attempt to perform human cloning, to participate or assist in attempt to perform human cloning, or to ship or receive for any purpose embryo produced by human cloning or any product derived from such embryo; provides construction re scientific research, etc. Creates 877.27; amends 95.11, 775.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Health Regulation: Favorable; Crime Prevention, Corrections & Safety: Favorable; Council for Healthy Communities: Favorable with one amendment

HB 1283 by Ausley, Justice, Arza, McGriff, Dockery, Argenziano, Bowen, Henriquez, Seiler, Harrell, Jennings, Peterman, Jordan and Benson (Identical CS/S 1500)

Parents' & Children's Day; renames "Children's Day" as "Parents' & Children's Day"; changes designated day for celebration of Parents' & Children's Day. Amends 683.17. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Child & Family Security: Favorable; Council for Healthy Communities: Favorable

HB 123 by Baxley, Flanagan, Harrell, Attkisson and Melvin (Compare CS/S 0426, CS/S 0462, S 2164)

Excise Tax on Documents; provides limit on amount of tax on promissory or nonnegotiable notes, written obligations to pay money, & assignments of wages or other compensation & on certain promissory or nonnegotiable notes, written obligations to pay money, or other compensation made in connection with sales made under retail charge account services. Amends 201.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Judicial Oversight: Favorable; Fiscal Responsibility Council: Favorable with two amendments
