HB 109 by Ryan (Linked H 0107)

HB 111 by Murman

Health Flex Plans; provides for pilot program for health flex plans for certain uninsured persons; exempts approved health flex plans from certain licensing requirements; provides criteria for eligibility to enroll in such plan; requires health flex plan providers to maintain certain records; provides requirements for denial, nonrenewal, or cancellation of coverage; specifies that coverage under approved health flex plan is not entitlement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 113 by Crow, Heyman, Farkas, Slosberg, Lerner and Detert (Similar S 0210)

Treated Wood; prohibits use of wood products treated with chromated copper arsenate in publicly funded playground equipment; provides for enforcement on state lands by DEP; requires DOE to provide notice to & develop guidelines for school districts re sealing of wood treated with chromated copper arsenate; prohibits state agencies from purchasing wood treated with chromated copper arsenate; provides exceptions, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 121 by Bennett (Identical S 0126)

Corporate Income Tax; amends provision which provides for apportionment of adjusted federal income to this state; revises conditions for determining when sales of tangible personal property occur in this state for certain industries; provides for retroactive effect. Amends 220.15. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 123 by Baxley

Excise Tax on Documents; provides limit on amount of tax on promissory or nonnegotiable notes, written obligations to pay money, & assignments of wages or other compensation & on certain promissory or nonnegotiable notes, written obligations to pay money, or other compensation made in connection with sales made under retail charge account services. Amends 201.08. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 125 by Gannon

Emergency Treatment/Rape Survivors; provides legislative intent; provides definitions; provides requirements for emergency treatment for survivors of rape; provides for counseling & for oral & written information about emergency contraception; provides for immediate access to medically appropriate emergency contraception, if requested, or for referral to facility that will provide access to such contraception. HB 127 by Barreiro

HB 129 by Barreiro

Motorsports Entertainment Complex; provides for distribution of portion of revenues from tax on sales, use, & other transactions to motorsports entertainment complex; provides for certification of such facility by Office of Tourism, Trade, & Economic Development of Executive Office of Governor; provides requirements for certification; provides for use of funds distributed to motorsports entertainment complex, etc. Amends 212.20; creates 288.1170. HB 131 by Lynn

Library Records/Confidentiality; revises provisions re confidentiality of public library registration & circulation records to authorize disclosure of information to parent or guardian of library patron under age 16, for purpose of collecting fines or recovering overdue books or other materials. Amends 257.261. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 133 by Lynn and Fasano

Husband & Wife Privilege/Disclosure; denies existence of privilege against disclosure in certain criminal proceedings. Amends 90.504. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

HB 135 by Bense, Benson, Jennings, Greenstein and Wiles

Firefighter Employment Safety; cites act as "Fla. Firefighters Occupational Safety & Health Act"; provides legislative intent; requires division to conduct study of firefighter occupational diseases; requires division to inspect places of firefighter employment & to develop safety & health programs for those firefighter employers whose employees have high frequency or severity of work-related injuries, etc. Creates 633.801-.821; amends 633.31-.33, 383.3362. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 137 by Hogan

Elderly Persons & Disabled Adults; defines term "position of trust & confidence"; prescribes civil remedies for theft & other offenses in which victim is elderly person or disabled adult; provides that violation of patient rights is not cause of action under act; authorizes court to advance trial on docket which involves victim who is elderly person or disabled adult; provides guidelines for registration of public guardians, etc. Amends Ch. 744, 772.11, 825.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 139 by McGriff and Heyman

Laser Lighting Devices; defines term "laser lighting device"; provides that it is second degree misdemeanor to knowingly & willfully shine beam of laser lighting device at law enforcement officer in such manner as to cause law enforcement officer to believe that firearm is pointed at him or her; provides penalty. Career Criminals; defines term "career criminal" for purposes of act; requires that offender who is convicted as habitual felony offender, habitual violent felony offender, violent career criminal, three-time violent felony offender, or prison releasee reoffender register with sheriff of county in which offender resides; requires that career criminal also register in person at driver's license office of HSMV, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

HB 145 by Wishner (Similar H 0025)

Florida Golf License Plate; provides for said license plate; provides for use fee; directs HSMV to develop said plate; provides for distribution & use of fees; requires Florida Sports Foundation to establish youth golf program; provides for advisory committee. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 147 by Ball

Citizens' Right to Honest Government; creates "Citizens' Right to Honest Government Act"; provides criminal penalties for official misconduct, criminal misuse of official position, disclosure or use of confidential criminal justice information, & bid tampering; provides criminal penalty for perjury in official proceeding by public servant; deletes specified felonies from & adds specified felonies to Criminal Punishment Code offense severity ranking chart, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

HB 149 by Littlefield

Second Amendment License Plate; creates Protect the Second Amendment license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such plates. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 151 by Waters (Similar S 0026)

Relief/Skowroneks/Clearwater; provides for relief of Eva Skowronek, as widow of Wieslaw Skowronek, & for relief of Anna Marie Skowronek, Victor Skowronek, & Hubert Skowronek, children of Wieslaw Skowronek, for death of Wieslaw Skowronek as result of negligence of City of Clearwater. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 153 by Brutus

Heir Finders; provides definitions; requires registration of heir finders & heir finder businesses; provides for license renewal & reactivation; provides for local licensing requirements; provides for licensing of nonresidents; provides for admitting certain documents into evidence in certain hearings; includes heir finders within provisions for distributions of certain property or money by Banking & Finance Dept., etc. Creates 717.151-.156; amends 717.123,.124. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

HB 155 by Trovillion

Public Lodging/Food Svc. Inspection; provides for recovery of costs incurred for reinspection of public lodging or public food service establishment to verify correction of violations found during prior inspection. Amends 509.032. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 157 by Gottlieb

Florida Dignity for All Students Act; creates said act; provides legislative findings re harassment, discrimination, & violence in Florida schools; prohibits specified conduct & provides for punitive measures; provides duties of educational institutions; amends provision re required instruction in public schools; requires character-development program to include information re harassment, discrimination, & violence, etc. Creates 228.2005; amends 233.061. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 159 by Bullard

Boulevard Designations/Miami-Dade; designates "Steven Cranman Boulevard" & "Ethel Beckford Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; designates "Phicol Williams Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; designates "Arthur Mays Boulevard" in Miami-Dade County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 161 by Garcia

Children/Relative Caregiver Program; amends provision re said program; amends provision re workforce development postsecondary student fees; exempts from payment of specified fees otherwise eligible students for whom state is paying relative caregiver payment; exempts certain children in custody of relative at time of reaching age 18 from payment of all undergraduate student fees; requires CFS Dept. to contract for study of relative caregivers in state, etc. Amends FS. HB 163 by Paul

Ad Val Tax/Disabled Ex-Service; increases amount of exemption provided under specified provision of State Constitution for certain disabled ex-service members. Amends 196.24. Effective Date: 01/01/2003.

HB 167 by Lynn

Student Assessment/Grade 10 CAT Test; provides requirements re passing scores on grade 10 Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test. Amends 229.57. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 169 by Weissman

Taxation; revises provisions re venue of taxpayer actions in circuit court; provides methods by which taxpayer is entitled to establish amount of overpayment of tax on sales, use, & other transactions under certain conditions; provides for review of facts & circumstances to determine existence of reasonable cause in connection with assessment of penalty against taxpayer, etc. Amends 72.011, 212.12, 213.21, 220.03, 608.471. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 171 by Weissman

Long-term Care; creates "Nursing Home Facility Whistleblower's Act" & "Assisted Living Facility Whistleblower's Act," respectively; prohibits retaliatory actions from facility or independent contractor against employee for disclosure of certain information; specifies nature of information, to whom disclosed, & persons protected; authorizes civil actions for violation; provides penalties; protects existing rights of employees, etc. Creates 400.0245, .455. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

HB 173 by Goodlette (Similar S 0180)

Excise Tax on Documents; provides that tax on deeds & other instruments re real property or interests therein applies to certificates of title issued in judicial sale of real property pursuant to court order or final judgment issued in foreclosure proceeding; provides method for computing tax; provides intent; provides for retroactive application. HB 175 by Lynn

Child Care Facilities; requires validation of certain information provided by applicant for child care facility license; requires CFS Dept. to establish & impose uniform penalties re child care facility violations; requires dept. to establish database of information re violations, citations, & penalties imposed against child care facilities regulated by state; provides duties of State Technology Office, etc. Amends Ch. 402, 409.146; repeals 402.316. HB 181 by Negron

FRS/Senior Management Service Class; includes general masters & child support hearing officers in Senior Management Service Class of Florida Retirement System. Amends 121.055. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 187 by Attkisson (Similar S 0008)

Relief/Hopkins & Bowman; provides for relief of Towanna Denise Hopkins, incompetent, by & through Willie Lee Hopkins, her father & legally appointed guardian, Robert Keith Bowman, Jr., son of Towanna Denise Hopkins, & Willie Lee Hopkins, individually; authorizes & directs Fla. Board of Regents, University of South Florida, & USF Health Sciences Center Insurance Company to compensate them for injuries & damages, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 189 by Siplin (Similar S 0074)

Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.; provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Steven Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 191 by Diaz de la Portilla

School Dist./Inspector General Off.; establishes Inspector General Office in each school district; provides for appointment of Inspector General; provides purpose of office; provides authority of Inspector General to conduct investigations & make recommendations; provides powers of Inspector General. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 193 by Gannon (Linked H 0195)

Insurer Rehabilitation & Liquidation; provides construction & purposes; cites as Insurers Rehabilitation & Liquidation Act; specifies application to certain persons & entities; provides for investigations by DOI preliminary or incidental to receivership proceedings; authorizes DOI to provide certain information in such investigations; imposes liability on certain persons or entities for certain actions, etc. Amends Ch. 631, 626.9541, 817.2341. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 195 by Gannon (Linked H 0193)

Public Records/Insurers Records; provides exemption from public records requirements for records of insurers subject to delinquency proceedings; provides for future review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 197 by Harper

School Emergency Preparedness; requires Education Department to adopt rules governing emergency drills which must be followed by each district school board. Amends 230.23. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

HB 199 by Harper (Linked H 0201)

Drug Abuse & Crime Prevention Act; creates said act as supplementary intervention program for certain nonviolent drug offenders; provides for drug treatment in lieu of reincarceration of parolees who commit nonviolent drug possession offense or violate any drug-related condition of their parole; provides for mandatory probation of persons convicted of nonviolent drug possession offense; provides exceptions, etc. Creates 949.151, .153; 947.31; 948.21. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 201 by Harper (Linked H 0199)

Drug Abuse Treatment Trust Fund; creates said trust fund within Corrections Department; provides for source of moneys & purposes; provides for annual carryforward of unused funds; provides for future review & re-creation of trust fund. Creates 949.155. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 205 by Sorensen

District Courts of Appeal; specifies minimum membership of district courts of appeal provides construction & application; provides criteria for selecting judges to fill vacancies; requests district courts of appeal judicial nominating commissions to adopt uniform rules of procedure. Amends 35.01. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 207 by Sorensen

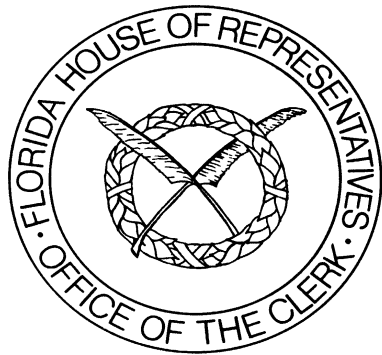
