Repackaged Raw Meat, Fish, Poultry; prohibits sale, delivery for sale, or offering for sale of repackaged or rewrapped raw meat, fish, or poultry that does not display specified labeling; reenacts provision re penalty for violation of certain provision to incorporate amendment, in reference thereto. Amends 500.04; reenacts 500.177(1). Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3235 by Morroni

Persons With Disabilities; requires placement of specified signs at self-service gasoline stations for purpose of identifying gasoline pumps

used to provide services to persons with disabilities; provides requirements for design & location of such signs; provides penalty. Amends 526.141. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3237 by Stabins

Bingo; revises definitions; provides requirements re conduct of bingo by members of charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organizations; revises requirements re prizes, days & times when bingo may be conducted, & players' responsibilities; prohibits video or computerized bingo cards; specifies that counties & municipalities may impose stricter regulations & adopt certain zoning ordinances, etc. Amends 849.0931. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3239 by Thrasher, Lippman, Bainter, Safley and Mackey (Similar S 0510)

Securities Transactions; specifies additional securities as exempt from certain registration requirements; clarifies exemption of certain securities in certain transactions from registration requirements; authorizes Banking & Finance Dept. to adopt certain rules for electronic deposits & filings; specifies notice filing requirements for federal covered advisers, etc. Amends Ch. 517. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3241 by Meek and Miller (Identical S 0420, Compare CS/H 1761, S 0262)

Firearms; defines term "locking device"; provides that locking device may be used for purpose of lawfully storing firearm within access of minor, as defined; requires person to secure firearm with locking device under specified circumstances when firearm is left or stored on premises where such minor resides; prohibits person who is not licensed firearms dealer from purchasing more than one handgun within 30-day period, etc. Amends Ch. 790. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3243 by Thrasher, Ritter, Bradley, Cosgrove, Flanagan, Byrd and Burroughs

Hearsay Evidence; revises exception to prohibition against hearsay evidence; applies to pending cases in which final pretrial conference occurs on or after effective date. Amends 90.803. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

HB 3245 by Livingston (Similar S 0452)

Fla. Mobile Home Act; revises definition of "pass-through charge"; revises provisions re bona fide offer of purchase made to mobile home park owner; provides for rights of mobile home owners when such offer of purchase includes other property or more than one mobile home park; revises definition of term "affiliate"; revises provisions re number of members which constitutes quorum re homeowners' associations, etc. Amends 723.003,.071,.072,.078. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3247 by Argenziano (Identical S 0442)

Forensic Client Services; specifies persons or entities that may file petition for proposed involuntary admission to residential services re forensic services; provides for petitions for defendants with autism; prohibits release from order for involuntary admission except by court order; amends & reorganizes Forensic Client Services Act; provides for client protection & security, etc. Amends 40.29, 393.11, Ch. 916; reenacts 394.467(7)(a). Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3249 by Fasano (Compare S 0338)

Sales Tax Exemption/Steam; includes steam within exemption for electricity used in certain manufacturing & related operations. Amends 212.08. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3251 by Boyd (Identical S 0470)

Land Use by G&FWFC; provides for recreational user permit fee to hunt, fish, or otherwise use for outdoor recreational purposes, land leased by Game & Fresh Water Fish Commission from private nongovernmental owners; provides for setting of fee by rule; provides for exceptions to application of fee. Amends 372.57. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3253 by Minton and Morse (Identical S 0446)

Opticianry; updates definition of "department"; defines term "refracting optician" & revises definition of "opticianry," to conform; authorizes refracting opticians to prescribe corrective lenses under certain circumstances; grants Board of Opticianry authority to adopt rules re standard of practice for refracting opticians & minimum equipment required to perform their work, etc. Amends Ch. 484; reenacts 484.011,.013(1)(c). Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3255 by Sindler, Safley, Feeney, Betancourt, Murman, Fischer, Merchant, Saunders, Casey, Rojas, Littlefield and Wise (Identical S 0502)

Court Cost/Law Enforcement Funding; imposes additional court cost on fines for criminal offenses in county & circuit courts; authorizes courts to increase amount under certain conditions; provides for deposit in Crime Stoppers Trust Fund; provides for distribution of such funds in trust fund by Legal Affairs Department to counties to support official Crime Stoppers & their programs. Creates 938.06; amends 16.555. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3257 by Sindler, Casey, Feeney, Murman, Betancourt, Fischer, Merchant, Saunders, Rojas, Melvin, Safley, Littlefield and Wise

DUI/Subsequent Convictions; provides third degree felony penalty for third or subsequent conviction for driving under influence; increases present fines & penalties to conform; conforms provisions in sentencing guidelines. Amends 316.193, 921.0022. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

HB 3259 by Wasserman Schultz

Condominium Owners/Cable TV Service; authorizes condominium households receiving supplemental security income or food stamps to discontinue cable television service without fees, penalties, or service charges. Amends 718.115. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3261 by Culp and Trovillion (Identical S 0496)

State Employee Telecommuting Program; repeals s. 3 of ch. 94-113, Laws of Florida; abrogates repeal of provision which establishes state employee telecommuting program. Abrogates repeal of 110.171. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

HB 3263 by Bronson

Robbery/Sudden Snatching; redefines offense of robbery to include robbery by sudden snatching; defines "sudden snatching"; provides for reclassification of offense to higher degree under specified circumstances when offender carried firearm or other deadly weapon; provides penalties; provides for ranking of robbery by sudden snatching within level 5 category of offense severity ranking chart. Amends 812.13, 921.0022. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3265 by Ziebarth

Boater Safety/Under Influence; lowers amount of alcohol required re certain boating under influence infractions; provides penalties for failure to submit to breath test or urine test; provides for suspension of privilege to operate vessel for persons who are under 21 years of age under certain circumstances; revises language re boater safety identification cards issued by DEP. Amends 327.35,.395; creates 327.35215,.35216. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3267 by Ziebarth

Collegiate License Plates; provides for generic collegiate specialty license plate for independent universities & community colleges in state; provides for individual decal representing specific independent university or community college; reduces number of signatures required to be obtained for issuance of such specialty plates. Amends 320.08058. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3269 by Gay

Special Districts; provides that candidates for governing board of certain single-county & multicounty special districts shall qualify in accordance with certain provisions; amends provisions which require special districts, including fire control districts, to submit draft codified charters to Legislature; revises deadline & requirements for such codification; provides that Legislature may adopt schedule for

codification. Amends 189.405,.429. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

HB 3271 by Lippman

Grand Juries/Members; increases maximum number of persons which may be appointed to serve on a grand jury. Amends 905.01. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3273 by Merchant (Identical S 0464)

Conserve Wildlife License Plate; creates Conserve Wildlife license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such license plates. Amends 320.08056,.08058. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3275 by Arnall (Compare CS/S 0190)

Drivers License Suspension/Bad Check; provides for suspension of driver's license re certain persons who do not fulfill agreement for bad check diversion program or against whom warrant or capias is issued in worthless check case; provides for notification & conditions for reinstatement; provides fee; directs HSMV & FDLE to develop & implement plan. Amends 322.251; creates 832.09. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3277 by Betancourt

WAGES Program; revises legislative intent; revises criteria for using vocational education or training & education services re employment; includes marketable skills within accountability criteria in statewide implementation plan; revises exception to penalty for noncompliance; revises prioritization of work requirements; revises use of contracts applications, etc. Amends 414.025,.027,.065,.105. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3279 by Betancourt

Obstruction of Law Enforcement; reclassifies or increases penalties for offenses of falsely assuming or pretending to be, or falsely personating, certain officers or specified personnel; provides that such false assumption or pretense is felony of second degree; provides that such false personation during course of commission of felony is felony of first degree; provides penalties, etc. Amends 843.08,.081, 921.0022. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3281 by Greene

Florida Housing Finance Corporation; requires that corporation allocate portion of low-income housing tax credits under Internal Revenue Code to projects involving qualified nonprofit organizations; provides responsibilities of such organizations; defines such organizations; provides applicability to certain previously approved projects & requires compliance. Amends 420.5099. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3283 by Andrews

Local Government Planning/Schools; requires each district school board to meet annually with board of county commissioners & with municipal governing bodies to plan for educational facilities; provides for notice; requires report; provides for arbitration; provides penalty. Creates 163.3182. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3285 by Clemons, Heyman, Crow, Burroughs, Wiles and Crist

Adjudication of Guilt; prohibits withholding of adjudication for certain defendants accused of committing felony offense; provides exceptions; provides definitions; repeals Rule 3.670, Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure, re rendition of judgment, to extent of inconsistency with act. Creates 775.0844. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3287 by Gay

Affordable Housing; clarifies application of certain provisions to State Housing Fund; specifies additional requirement for contracts with Florida Housing Finance Corporation; provides duties of Comptroller re certain advances to corporation; clarifies application to corporation's fiscal year; provides corporation with limited benefits of sovereign

immunity, etc. Amends Ch. 420; repeals 420.504(8). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3289 by Regulated Services (EIC) and Morroni

State Lottery Requirements; requires certain number of clerks to be on duty at certain lottery retailer locations; deletes requirement that Lottery Dept. lease all instant vending machines for specified initial evaluation period. Amends 24.105,.111. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3291 by Valdes, Garcia, Morse and Barreiro

Telecommunications Rights-of-Way; creates "Telecommunications Rights-of-Way Act"; provides legislative findings & intent; provides definitions; provides requirements re consent necessary for use of streets & public rights-of-way; provides for permissible taxes, fees, & charges. Creates 337.4011-.4015. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3293 by Barreiro

Sales Tax/Cruise Property; provides exemption for sale, use, consumption, or storage of tangible personal property within specified area if property is purchased by certain cruise passengers; requires that property be removed from state within specified period; provides for issuance of cruise arrival-departure card to passengers; requires notification to Revenue Dept. of any card issued to person who is not cruise passenger, etc. Amends 212.06. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3295 by Trovillion

Fire Protection Contractors; changes expiration & renewal of certificates of competency for fire protection contractors from annual to biennial basis; revises continuing education requirements & provides transitional continuing education requirements, to conform; increases renewal fee, to conform; amends certain provision re engaging in business or acting in capacity of contractor of automatic fire sprinkler systems, to conform. Amends 633.537,.524,.60. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HJR 3297 by Andrews

School District/Superintendents; constitutional amendment to provide that Legislature, by general law, may authorize the State Board of Education to assume control of school district when schools within

school district or school district itself is low performing, to include removal of superintendent of schools. Amends ss. 4 & 5, Art. IX.

HB 3299 by Argenziano (Identical S 0512)

Excess Utility Payments Refund; requires Comptroller to provide refund to certain utility customers who paid more under uniform rate structure than those customers would have paid under modified stand-alone rate structure; requires Public Service Commission to notify utility customers who are eligible for refund; provides requirements for applying for refund; requires Comptroller to verify eligibility for refund, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3301 by Betancourt (Identical S 0494)

Domestic Violence; redefines term "domestic violence" for purposes of training provided by Florida Court Educational Council; prohibits court from awarding visitation rights to parent who has been convicted of capital felony or first-degree felony that involved domestic violence; requires that Supreme Court require judges who hear cases involving domestic violence to attend educational programs on domestic violence, etc. Amends 25.385, 61.13. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

HB 3303 by Brown (Similar S 0200, Compare CS/ ENG/H 1589)

County Court Assessments; provides that county commission may assign collection of fines, court costs, & other costs imposed by county court & remaining unpaid after certain period to private attorney or collection agency under specified circumstances; provides for authorization by county commission of any additional fee to offset collection costs. Amends 34.191. Effective Date: Contingent.

HR 9301 by Bullard

Perrine-Cutler Ridge Council, Inc.; commends Perrine-Cutler Ridge Council, Inc., for its contributions to business & civic life of communities of Perrine & Cutler Ridge.

HR 9303 by Bullard

Brice, John R.; recognizes heroism of John R. Brice during World War II & achievements & contributions of his life.

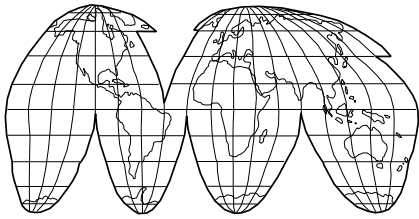
